## Reo's Seaton leads 9/11 event

**T**EN YEARS removed from 9/11, the impact of that day remains evident at Reo Distribution's Virginia facility.

In President Reo B. Hatfield's office hangs a large photograph of Hatfield's son and namesake, Reo III, in Army uniform alongside Gen. David Petraeus, the leader of America's troop surge in Iraq, a turning point in a war that threatened to turn into a quagmire. It's a constant reminder for the fiercely patriotic Hatfield of the significance of 9/11.

"I'm so proud of this country and I'm so proud of what our fighting men and women have done to protect us since that terrible day," said Hatfield, himself a military veteran. "Their courage and vigilance have protected us and shown our enemies

that America is still strong."

Hatfield was especially proud to see of the company's own, accounts manager Anne Seaton, lead 9/11 observances in Waynesboro, Va., headquarters of Reo Distribution.

She worked with local artist Mark Cline to help see through his vision of displaying an artistic version of the Twin Towers in downtown Waynesboro.

"This reminds us of the importance of continuing the fight for freedom that's been a part of our country from the beginning," Hatfield said. "I'm just so proud of Anne and Mark both."

The display was the focal point of Waynesboro's 9/11 observance which also featured Virginia Military Institute bagpipers performing "Amazing Grace."
